Michie Tavern / Monticello Drive - 11/11/17

Well, the original question was "Who needs one more drive for 2017?", and the answer is just a hardy few. Saturday morning arrived with chilly temperatures, but thankfully, dry conditions. At our meet-up point at Lake Wright, we realized we were not acclimated to those temps quite yet, and the MGs were all top-up. Off we went - Cynthia & Andy in their B, Rose & Donald in a rather large pseudo-MG, and Karen & Tad happy to have their B back on the road after some minor surgery. We met up with PJ (Nanook?), who was directing traffic at the I-64 rest stop in full arctic clothing and his top-down B.

Side story - at the rest stop, another traveler relayed to PJ an exchange he had with his wife a few miles earlier on the highway: Wife - "Look at that crazy person with the top down." Husband - "But look at him - he has a bigger smile than anyone else on the road today."

From there we were off to meet Alan & Robin in Richmond for a back-road drive out US-60, through Trenholm, Tamworth, Cartersville and Carysbrook, passing a Veteran's Day ceremony in Dixie. We arrived at the appointed time at Michie Tavern, and met Karen & Tad's son, daughter-in-law and grandson for lunch. The buffet was tasty and filling, and with the discount for the veterans in our group, it was a very good deal. By the time we left, there were crowds lined up to get in. Reservations and an early start highly recommended. Although we didn't have time to wander the grounds at the tavern, it looks like a place we should return for a longer visit.

Our tour guide (Karen & Tad's niece, Kelsey) gave an interesting presentation of the main floor of the house. Each guide covers about the same material, but creates their own script and adds their own insights into the history. Much of what is in the house is original, including a copy of the Declaration of Independence (TJ's very own copy each signer received one). After the tour, the TMGC group was treated to a private tour of the upper floors of the house and into the dome (yes, it is an octagon). There, we got the story of some of the lesser known characters in the household and saw several interesting design elements that often go unnoticed. Did you know the two round windows at the house-end of the dome are slightly smaller, and the bottom half of each is a mirror? It gives the illusion of light, and lets you look out without staring at the side of the main house. See Donald's mini-Monticello_44 photo on our website.

From Monticello, and after a brief fuel stop, it was back to Tidewater. Highway 250 is always the preferred route from C-ville back to Richmond, and although it was getting dark, the road was mostly clear and there were no trucks to contend with for road space. We picked up I-64 just west of Richmond, and hung on the rest of the way, arriving well after dark, but safely home. Is it sad to see the end of the 2017 driving season? Not really. Holiday Lights are coming in just a few weeks, and the first official drive of 2018 is only 67 days after that. It'll pass in a flash.
