Amazing!

Activity Report – October 2017



September 6, 2017 TMGCCC Meeting Minutes

The September 6 meeting of the TMGCCC was held at the Ocean View Fishing Pier in Norfolk. Due to inclement weather, the meeting was held in the inside restaurant rather than the outside upper deck, and President Robert Perrone opened the meeting at 7:39 by thanking Tad Carter for setting up the venue. Minutes from the August meeting were approved by voice vote, and then Robert called for the Treasurer's report. Jim Villers reported that after \$705.00 income from dues and \$150.00 expenditures for the July picnic as well as newsletter production, the Club has a balance of \$2,395.72.

Historian Susan Bond was in attendance, but did not bring in the history albums due to the rain. She also shared that her husband Terry is "laid up" with a broken leg as of August 6, which will affect his mobility and ability to host the Fall Tech Session. Vice President Tad Carter gave the traditional "VP Shrug" report, then launched into the Activities report. First, "Thanks" was expressed to Jim and Linda Freeh for hosting the August Tech Session. Then Tad provided a brief description of the Syzygy Tour which traveled to South Carolina for viewing the recent total eclipse. Don Ladd took lots of pictures of the tour which will be on line soon, and there is a writeup to come in a future Dipstick. The consensus of the Tourers was that it was a truly amazing event, and plans are already begun for the next one on 4/8/24. September is "show month", with the Wings and Wheels show, the American MGC Register meet in Abingdon, VA, the Shenandoah car show, an October Flash Drive, and the Fall Tech Session. Our next meeting will be at the home of Pete Olson, where we'll have a chili cook-off.

Membership Chairman Bill Yoshida updated us on the current roster, which totals 101 paid members with 199 cars. Mark and Mary Ann Harris of Charlottesville have joined as new members; they have a '53 TD, '59 Twin Cam MGA, '63 MGB, '69 MGC, and a '70 MGB-GT. Bill also provided an update on members who have moved or sold MGs. Dipstick Editor Mark Davidoski expressed his thanks to Mike Haag and Jim Villers for their continued work in producing and publishing the Dipstick, and thanked Jim for his recent article on LED light replacements. Mark asked for volunteers to submit a writeup for the upcoming Pungo Wings and Wheels show. Andy Wallach "stepped up to the plate" and will take that on.

David Kinsey discussed regalia availability, and said he is developing sources for logos, grill badges, embroidery, etc. so that members can order things for themselves. This will be posted on the club website when the sources are developed. The president then inquired as to Old Business (none), New Business (none), and Marque Tyme news(nothing). Robert provided an election update as to who is currently running for officers to be chosen next month. Bill Olcheski has agreed to serve as President, Faith Peterson is the nominee for VP, and the position of Secretary is still open. Robert volunteered to take this on, but entreated the membership to show more participation for supporting the club by running for offices. Cynthia Faschini volunteered to run for Secretary. Jim Villers and Bill Yoshida have agreed to remain as Treasurer and Membership Chair, respectively, but Bill stated he would be willing to give it up if someone else was interested in Membership.

The evening raffle was then held. Sue Bond won the "My other car is an MG" sticker, and other prizes included an embroidered patch of the club logo, an Old Speckled Hen bottle opener, a TMGCCC fridge magnet, and \$30 won by Kirk Cizerle in the 50/50 raffle which he then generously donated to the club. 
