

Grayhaven Winery began producing their boutique wines in 1995 using Vinifera and French hybrid grapes. Among the estategrown wines currently produced are Pinotage, Marechal Foch, Sauvignon Blanc, Chambourcin, Cabernet Franc, Traminette and Cayuga. Grayhaven is owned and operated by 3 generations of the Peples family.



#### **Cooper Vineyards**

Our visit to Cooper let us see a winery in its earliest stages. Those that returned in 2011 saw a significantly upgraded facility. Cooper now produces about 1750 cases of wine per year, including their highly rated Norton wines.



#### Lake Anna Winery

Founded in 1983, the original winery was housed in a 1940's era dairy barn on the family farm. A 2000 expansion, which brought the current tasting room, warehouse, tank room and crush pad, more than doubled their production capacity.



#### **Barboursville Vineyards**

No MG-loving oenophile's search would be complete without a visit to Barboursville and an examination of their Octagon wines. The name is derived from the shape of the Great Room in the original estate, designed by Thomas Jefferson for Governor James Barbour.



#### **Horton Vineyards**

After years of research into which grapes would produce the best wines in this area, Dennis Horton established his vineyard in 1988 on 55 acres in Orange county. Horton now grows Viognier, Marsanne, Mourvedre, and Cabernet Franc grapes, along with native Norton grapes





The original Belle Mount Plantation was established in 1707 by a grant from King George. Three centuries later, we enjoy wines from grapes grown on the property. A toast - to King George!



#### Oak Crest Vineyards

Founder Conrad Brandts' adventures in wine making date back to the '50's, although it wasn't until 1986 when he first planted vines on this property. The Oak Crest name has special meaning. Oak trees border the crest surrounding the vineyard, oak is used for the barrels in which the wine is aged, and the oak tree is part of the Brandts' German crest.



#### Ingleside Vineyards

Opened in 1980, Ingleside is one of Virgnia's largest and oldest wineries. Nearby, you can explore the birthplace of George Washington, Robert E. Lee and James Monroe.

Ingelside Plantation built in 1834, was originally a boy's school. The 3000-acre plantation has also served as a dairy farm.



#### **Gray Ghost Vineyards**

The winery's name pays homage to John S. Mosby. It is located at the southern end of what was known as Mosby's Confederacy in the Civil War. Mosby's small cavalry unit caused so much chaos for Union troops without being detected, he was referred to as the "Gray Ghost". The lettering used on the label and in the winery logo is a composite of known samples of Mosby's writing.



#### **Old HouseWinery**

It was Mother's Day '88 when the owners first found this 75 acre property and the abandoned farm house. With the help of family and friends, they transformed the property into Old House Vineyards. The farm house (circa 1800) has been restored to an inviting gathering place for the enjoyment of good food and wine.

#### Naked Mountain Winery

The first vines were planted in 1976, and what started as four rows grew to 6 acres, producing 6000 cases of wine annually. Naked Mountain Chardonnay has been served at the White House - once under George H.W. Bush and once under Bill Clinton



#### **Hickory Hill Vineyards**

First planted as a hobby in 1984, Hickory Hill has grown over 28 years into a successful 3-generation family wine business, producing their first wines in 2001. The tasting room is situated in a 1923-era farm house. They feature Chardonnay, Vidal Blanc, Merlot and the everyone's favorite Cabernets, Franc and Sauvignon.



#### **Peaks of Otter Winery**

The wines of Peaks of Otter Winery are made from an assortment of fruits, all grown at Johnson's Orchards Farm. In addition to grapes, you will find flavors of apples, blackberries, peaches, cherries, elderberries and chili peppers. You'll experience wines like nowhere else, including "Kiss the Devil" Pepper wine and "Salty Frog" Margarita wine.



#### Savoy-Lee Winery

After a 20-year career in the Marines, owner Dave Wood decided to turn his passion for wine-making into his retirement plan. Starting with 100 acres, the first crush was in 2004 and the first release of Savoy-Lee wines was in 2005.

#### **Blenheim Vineyards**

The original Blenheim house was built in the late 18th century by Edward Carter and was named for the Bavarian village where the decisive 1704 battle in the War of Spanish Succession was fought. The original vineyard was established in 2000 by Dave Matthews, with a second vineyard planted in 2007.



#### **Blue Mountian Brewery**

Producing 2500 barrels (about 80,000 gallons) annually, Blue Mountains's ales and lagers are all brewed on site. As a member of the Virginia Green program, including environmental efforts in many of the day-to-day activities. Blue Mountain opened in 2007 and recently expanded their restaurant to accommodate their regulars and other visitors.



#### **DelFosse Vineyards**

The newest vineyard in Virginia, DelFosse produces a variety of wines ranging from Merlot to Petit Mensang, The DelFosse family invites you to come out for a picnic, a hike or a bike ride on their trails - then reward yourself with some really good wine!

#### **Bluemont Vineyards**

Nestled on the eastern slope of the Blue Ridge Mountian's, Bluemont Vineyards' tasting room offers spectacular views of the Virginia countryside all the way into Reston, Tysons Corner and Dulles. Enjoy the view as you enjoy your wines!



#### Swedenburg Estate Vineyard

When the Swedenburgs acquired Valley View Farm in the mid-80's, it was with the idea of working the land and making their home financially self-sufficient. The planted grapes as an alternative to soybean, and raised Black Angus cattle. 1987 brought the first grape crushing. The winery produces 1000 - 1500 cases annually - in Mr. Swedenburg's words, "enough for the family with a little left over to sell."



#### Quattro Goomba's Winery

Quatro Goomba's is a unique micro-winery, producing Mediterranean-style wines. Italian for "4 close friends", the name represents the owners' passion for friendship, family, celebration and tradition. The winery began commercial operations in 2006.

#### **DuCard Vineyard**

As owner Scott Elliff has said, "It's a hobby gone wild." After a decade of growing grapes for other wineries, DuCard began making their own wines about 3 years ago. DuCard Vineyards has been recognized as one of the two greenest wineries in Virginia for their stewardship of the land. Check out their website for a list of their environmental practices.



#### **Sweely Estate Winery**

Situated in the foothills of the beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains, the vineyard began in 2004. The Sweely family started with a vision for the property. Planting imported French vines, they set out to make worldclass wines and to share their passion for great food, wines and art.

The theme on the winery logo is a tribute to the Sweely's other interest - Acorn Hill Equestrian Center.



#### **Bluestone Vineyard**

We were greeted at the winery by owners Curt and Jackie Hartman and their MG.

In a temporary winery in 2009, Bluestone Vineyards produced 500 cases of wine. With 1000 new vines and a modern winery, they processed 31 tons of grapes and made 2000 cases of wine.






